Did you know?
You can use Apprenticeships to upskill existing staff

This is ideal for Teaching Assistants and other school-based support staff already working in a Physical Education and school sports setting.

The course enables staff to further their professional development and gain an additional professional qualification within the delivery of PE and school sport.

The course can be tailored to suit the needs of the individual and off-the-job training can be delivered face to face or remotely to suit the needs of both the individual and employer.

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How is the Apprenticeship Funded?

From April 2022 the National Minimum wage for apprentices will be £4.81 per hour regardless of age if it is their first apprenticeship year.

If your organisation pays into an apprenticeship levy, then all training fees will be paid for out of this.

Non-Levy paying employers will share the cost of training and assessing their apprentices with the government. Employers will pay 5% towards the cost of apprenticeship training with the government paying the rest (95%).

Example: L2 Apprentice Sports Coach cost of training £6000, employer contribution £300 (5%) Employers are also eligible for £1000 government funding for hiring an apprentice between the ages of 16-18

Active Fusion is offering 50% match funding (value £450).

This offer, funded through our charitable funds, is available to all Voluntary and Community Sector organisations wishing to train an existing or new member of staff through the Level 3 Apprenticeship.
