What ages does Fusion Camp cater for?

Fusion Camps are for children aged 5-11 years old unless stated otherwise.

Does my child qualify for a reduced place?

Children who are entitled to benefit-related Free School Meals and have a Unique Reference Number (URN) can access some of our camps for a reduced price of £5.00 thanks to funding from the Million Hours Fund and Tween Bridge Wind Farm. Please note that reduced priced tickets are not available for all camp locations. There are also a very limited number of free places available each day for young carers under 18 who look after a child aged 5–11 who may wish to attend this camp, thanks to the generous support of Hillards Charitable Trust.

Where can I find my Unique Reference Number?

If your child is eligible for a free place at this camp then you will have received a letter from Doncaster Council dated 31st May 2024 with this number attached. If you cannot locate your URN please contact Doncaster Council directly.

My child does not qualify for a free place, can they still attend?

Of course, however, there is a small charge of £12.00 per child, per day to help us sustain our camps, cover staffing costs and ensure that camps are accessible for all children.



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What can my child expect during Fusion Camps?

A bucket load of activities, every school holiday. With great value sports and creative arts to enjoy each half-term, we have plenty for your children to get stuck into in the school break! A more detailed agenda will be sent out to all booked parents/guardians prior to the camps commencing.

What does my child need to bring to camp?

Please provide your children with a packed lunch, a refillable water bottle and any further snacks or refreshments that they may require. Please be reminded that our camps are a nut-free zone. Please also ensure that your child is dressed in clothing and footwear suitable for sporting activities. We reserve the right to confiscate nut products and/or refuse entry to any participants not in suitable clothing and footwear.

My child has allergies or other requirements, how do I let Active Fusion know about this?

When completing the booking form, you will be asked to complete a participant form on behalf of your child where you will be prompted to provide details on allergies, dietary requirements, special educational needs and any other requirements unique to them.

Is my child allowed to bring their mobile phone to Fusion Camp?

Your child is allowed to bring their mobile to camp but we ask that they are switched off and put away during camp hours. This not only provides a safe environment for all attendees but also ensures that your child fully benefits from all that Fusion Camp has to offer.



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My child arrived late to camp and the door is locked. How do we access the building?

All of our camp venues are secured 15 minutes after the camp start time to provide a secure environment for all participants. If you arrive late to camp and cannot access the building then please contact our office on [01302 637276](tel:01302637276) who will notify camp leads.

How do I contact Active Fusion throughout the school holidays?

Can my child walk home alone or be collected by a minor such as an older sibling?

We advise all parents, guardians, and carers to collect their children directly from camp. If your child is permitted to walk home independently, you must provide written consent in advance by emailing remi@activefusion.org.uk prior to the camp. Your email must include: your full name, your child's name, the camp they are attending, the dates on which they may walk home alone, and a clear statement granting permission. Please note that children cannot be collected by siblings or other family members under the age of 18, unless we receive an email similar to the above.

Who do I contact in the event of a safeguarding issue?
